
FREE ICED TEA (2000) JOSHUA GREENE

In the fall of 2000, Joshua Greene, a San Francisco-based conceptual artist, of fered free iced tea on Wednesdays at the A2 cafe in San Francisco. Flyers for these free iced tea sessions were distributed at the cafe and in the surrounding areas and educational facilities. Persons who responded to the free iced tea posters were given a chip for an iced tea to be redeemed at the counter. These chips were then counted by the A2 counter staff, and Greene was charged for the corresponding number of iced teas. Although it is unclear as to what the exact content of the conversations were, it is certain that each individual took a chip from Greene, and that the chip was a stand-in for money during each individual's economic interaction at the A2 cafe.

One viewer (who wished to remain anonymous) had this to say: "I wanted to do the thing, but they didn't have any decaf tea that day. I haven't had caffeing in three years. I almost did it for art, but I just listened to people talk instead."



It Takes Two

The concept of the action (It Takes Two) was developed for the performance festival Stromereien in Zurich, but was realised the first time in the context of the workshop entgegen. San Keller sits on a public bench and remains seated till someone sits down next to him. If there is some kind of exchange San Keller remains on the bench. If no exchange takes place San Keller sits on the next bench, etc. In Helmstedt San Keller announced his presence in the daily newspaper, so that the inhabitants would know about the stranger sitting on their park benches. In the context of Stromereien San Keller announced his presence but to the festival visitors, although he placed a cushion emblazoned with the words Please sit next to me beside him.
