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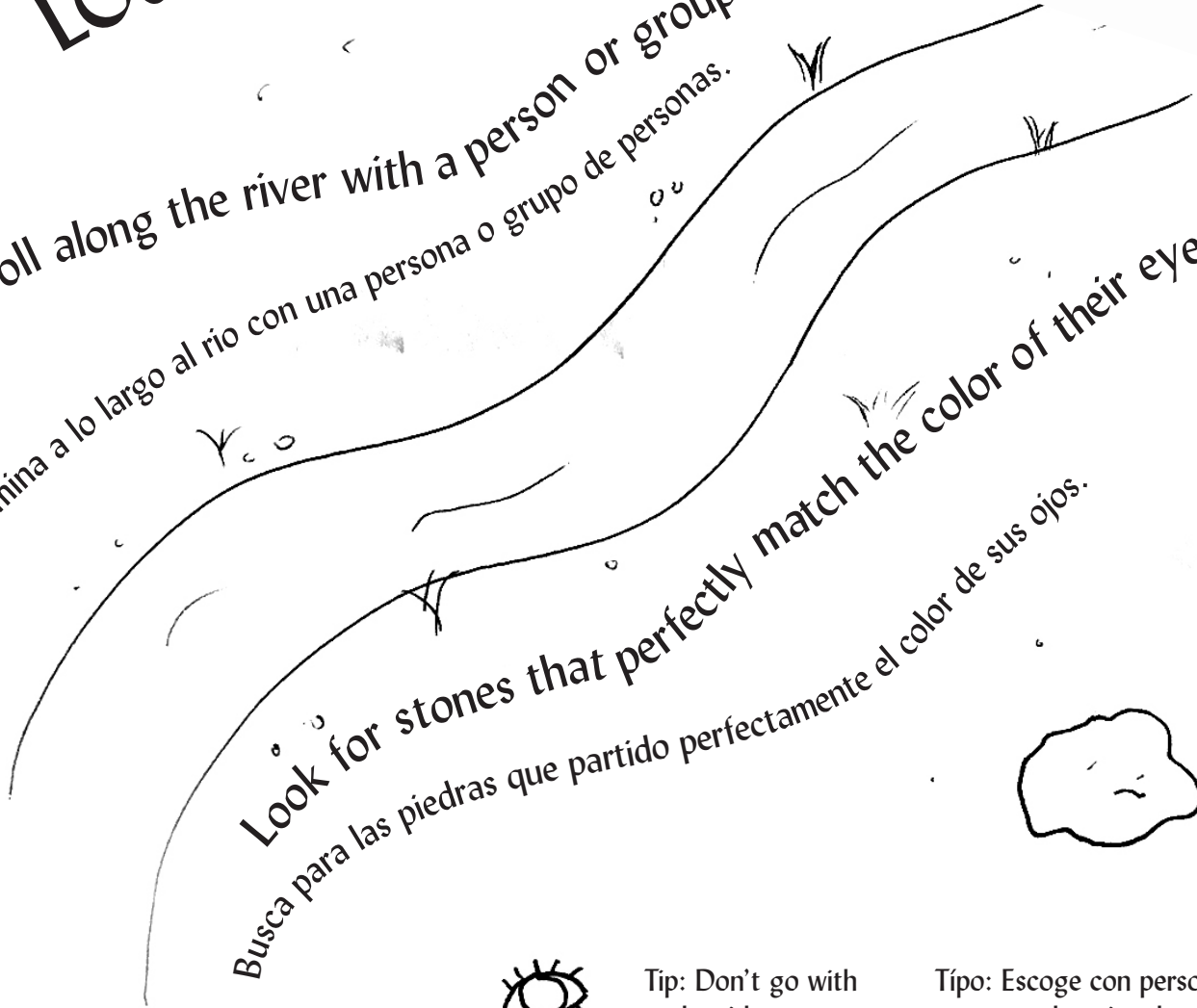

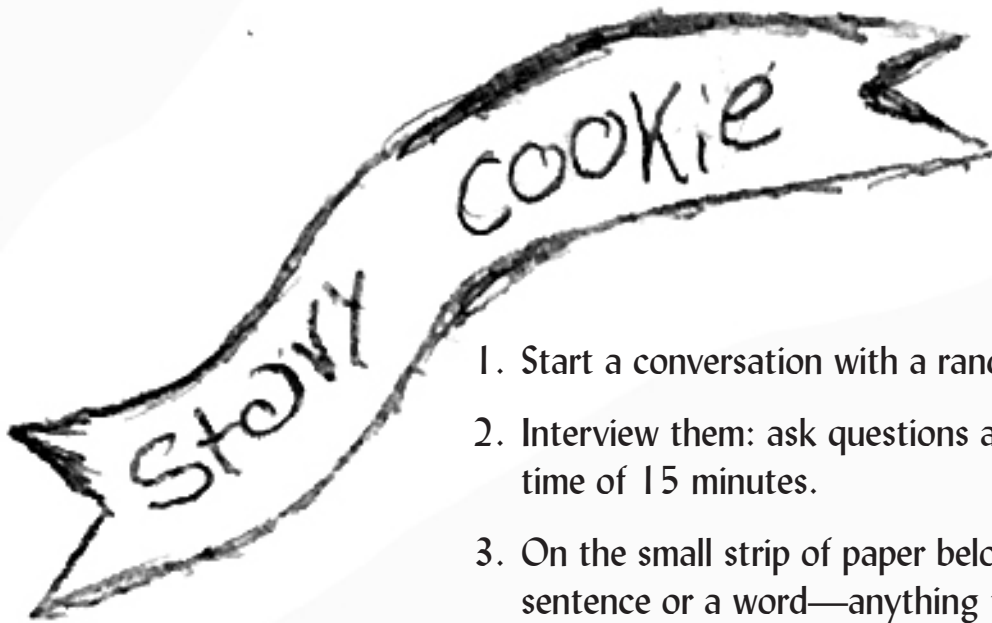

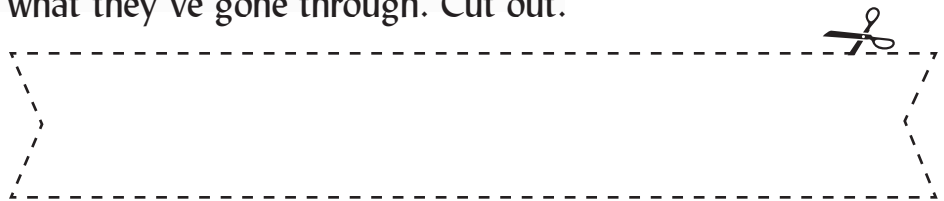
Steps

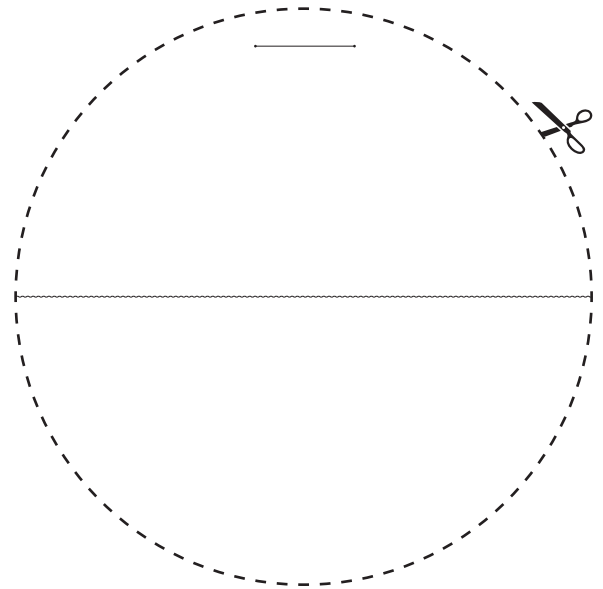
1. Start a conversation with a random person that you bump into.
