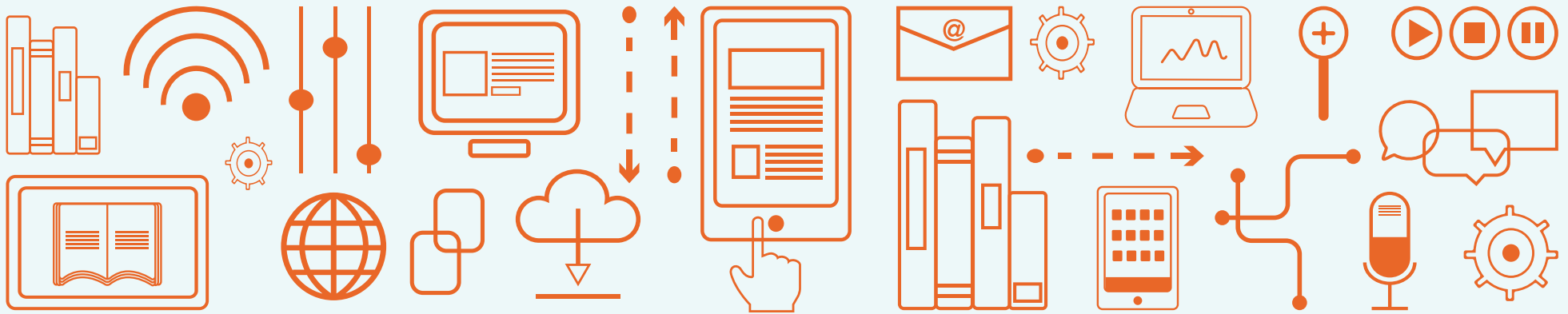

TIPS FOR REDUCING THE COST OF TEXTBOOKS

CREATE YOUR *own* TEXTBOOK

As part of the Provost's Challenge reTHINK PSU projects, faculty partnered with the Library to publish five open access textbooks:

- Comprehensive Individualized Curriculum and Instructional Design (SPED 510)
- Gender and Sexualities: An Inquiry (UNST 231)
- Introduction to Mathematical Analysis (MTH 311)
- Preadvanced Japanese (JPN 399)
- Spatial Thinking in Planning Practice: An Introduction to GIS (USP 531)

These textbooks saved students over \$45,000 in just 2 terms!

The Library is always accepting proposals to publish Open Access Textbooks.

You create the content and the Library will host the textbook, register the ISBN, enable access, track use, and serve as the archive.
