Population Growth in Oregon: 2000-2004

The population of the state of Oregon grew to 3,582,600 as of July 1, 2004, an increase of 161,101 people, or 4.7 percent, from the 2000 census count. Oregon's natural increase (births minus deaths) registered 69,985 persons in the four-year period, accounting for 43 percent of the total growth. The remaining 57 percent was due to net migration. Compared to the 2002-2003 period, the annual growth rate increased from 1.1 percent to 1.2 percent, reflecting the improving economy.

While the statewide growth rate reached 4.7 percent during 2000 to 2004, the population change varied considerably for Oregon's six metropolitan areas and for its 36 counties. The newest metropolitan area, Bend, has become the fastest growing Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) since 2000, with a growth rate of 17.4 percent. The newly expanded Portland-Vancouver-Beaverton MSA grew by 6.4 percent (the new definitions released by the Office of Management and Budget on June 6, 2003 added Skamania County in Washington to the MSA). The Medford MSA grew by 5.5 percent, followed by the Salem MSA (4.7 percent). The other two, Corvallis MSA and Eugene-Springfield MSA trailed behind the state average, with growth rates of 4.6 and 3.2 percent, respectively.

Among the state's 36 counties, Deschutes was the fastest growing county since 2000, with double-digit growth of 17 percent. Two other Central Oregon counties also grew considerably above the state average. Crook County grew by 7.6 percent, and Jefferson County grew by 6.5 percent. The growth in Central Oregon was primarily driven by net migration, which accounted for 85 percent of the overall population change. While Central Oregon witnessed the highest growth rate, the largest population increase occurred in Washington County, where more than 34,000 residents

were added since April 1, 2000. Multnomah County ranked second, gaining about 25,000 people. Both counties' growth was primarily due to natural increase, though Washington County was the second largest destination for net migration in the state.

Ten counties---Clackamas, Columbia, Crook, Deschutes, Jackson, Jefferson, Marion, Morrow, Washington, and Yamhill grew faster than the state average between April 1, 2000 and July 1, 2004. The remaining 26 counties experienced slower or negative growth. Among them, seven counties witnessed net population losses.

The population of Oregon's incorporated cities and towns reached 2,434,922 on July 1, 2004, accounting for 68 percent of the state's total population. The estimates, however, need to be evaluated with caution, especially for large cities. The soaring number of building permits issued in 2002 and 2003, on which the housing unit method is based for city population estimates, may inflate the population figures. Not all permits materialized into actual construction by the estimate date, and not all new constructions were occupied. Adjustments were made for the 2004 city population estimates in order to help take into account the difference between building permit applications and actual additions to the housing stock.

Adjustments for the 2004 City Population Estimates

The Population Research Center uses the housing unit method for city population estimates. Each year we send out a City Population Questionnaire, requesting each city to report building permits, number of mobile homes, and group quarters population. We apply an adjustment factor of 0.98 to the net building permits number, assuming that 2 percent of the building permits never get built. The adjustment factor is based on the U. S. Census Bureau's research. We then add the adjusted building permit number to the city's housing inventory of previous year, multiplied times the persons per housing unit from the 2000 Census, to obtain the household population. We add the household population to the group quarters population to arrive at the city population. Finally we round the numbers to the nearest ten.

In the past, we had been collecting the building permits data for the period of July of the previous year to June of the estimate year. Therefore, even the building permits issued in June, for example, were used as a proxy for the actual housing units in the July 1 estimates, with occupancy rates the same as the existing housing units in 2000. This practice, as a result, tended to lead to an inflated population as of July 1 of the estimate year.

The U.S. Census Bureau's research suggests that for single family housing units, it takes on average 6 months from the issuance of a building permit to the completion of construction; for multiple family housing units, the average time is at least 9 months, with variations corresponding to the number of units in the structure. Based on these findings, we decided that starting 2004, the building permits data should be collected from January to December of the previous year to allow enough time for the building permits to materialize into actual housing units. As with most transitions, the change

requires an adjustment in the initial period, such as 2004. Building permits data from January to June 2003 had already been integrated in the 2003 estimates, therefore should not be included again in the 2004 estimates. As a result, only July to December were used for the 2004 estimates. That explains why cities are only seeing about half the growth as expected.

This transition based on a new method only affects 2004. And, in fact, 2004 is a good year for this transition. 2002 and 2003 witnessed a large boom in the number of building permits, primarily reflecting the historically low interest rates. Many of these building permits may not necessarily translate into population in 2003. To some extent, the 2003 city populations displayed unusually high growth and now the 2004 estimates are scaling these inflated estimates back to normal.

We believe the adjustment helps to take into account the potential overestimates and improves the accuracy of the city population estimates. The comparison with the 2003 figure may not seem quite meaningful this year, but the 2004 estimates as well as the future city estimates will prove to be closer to reality.

Starting 2005, the city estimates will be using the full calendar year data of the previous year.

Population Estimates for Oregon, July 1, 2004

This report presents population estimates for Oregon and its counties and incorporated cities for July 1, 2004. The eleven tables in this report show current 2004 population estimates as well as historical data.

- Table 1 presents the components of population change for the state of Oregon, from April 1, 1960 to July 1, 2004.
- Table 2 shows the population by area types and the population for specific metropolitan areas from April 1, 2000 to July 1, 2004.
- Table 3 shows the components of population change for Oregon's counties, from April 1, 2000 to July 1, 2004.
- Table 4 shows the population size for the state of Oregon and its counties and incorporated cities, from April 1, 1990 to July 1, 2004.
- Table 5 shows population information on Oregon's incorporated cities that are located in more than one county.
- Table 6 presents the rank of Oregon's incorporated cities by their July 1, 2004 population size.
- Table 7 offers an alphabetical listing of Oregon's incorporated cities with their estimate of population size on July 1, 2004 and the change between April 1, 2000 and July 1, 2004.
- Table 8 presents information on the population added to incorporated cities due to annexation between April 1, 2000 and July 1, 2004.

- Table 9 displays estimates for the population by age and sex for the state of Oregon and its counties for July 1, 2004.
- Table 10 shows estimates for the population by selected age groups (birth to 17 years of age, 18 to 64 years of age, and 65 years of age and older) for the state of Oregon and its counties for July 1, 2004.

State Requirements for Population Estimates

Oregon law (Oregon Regulatory Statutes 190.510 to 190.610) mandates the Population Research Center, Portland State University, acting on behalf of the State Board of Higher Education, to prepare annual population estimates for each county and incorporated city in the state of Oregon. The principal purpose of the population estimates is for the allocation of selected tax revenues to cities and counties.

Oregon state government organized a State Census Office in Portland in 1956. The purpose of the State Census Office was to oversee and certify special censuses that rapidly growing towns conducted in order to document their population figures. The State Census Office eventually expanded its role to include the certification of the population added by annexations and the preparation of annual population estimates for counties.

Administrative responsibilities for population estimates were transferred to Portland State University in 1965, when Portland State College changed its name to Portland State University. The Population Research Center is located within the College of Urban and Public Affairs.

Duties of the Population Center

In addition to preparing population estimates and projections, the Center houses the Oregon State Data Center, the lead agency in Oregon for contact and collaboration with the U.S. Bureau of the Census and for dissemination of census data and documents. This information includes current and past census data for Oregon as well as results from Census Bureau surveys.

The Population Center provides a research and teaching focus for the investigation of the causes and consequences of demographic change in current society. Typical research activities include enrollment forecasts for school districts, survey research on population issues, social and economic factors affecting demographic change, population distribution and migration, population geography, and demographic methods. Population staff regularly assists city, county, and state governments on examination of population issues.

Staff in the Population Center teaches in the School of Urban Studies and Planning, College of Urban and Public Affairs. The School of Urban Studies and Planning offers a graduate certificate program in applied demography, an applied demography curriculum in the Master of Urban Studies degree program, and a graduate concentration within applied demography in the Ph.D. program.

Methods for Population Estimates

We include all residents in cities, counties, and the state in the population estimates. Residents include people living in their own homes, rental homes or apartments, mobile homes, or in college dormitories, nursing homes, jails and prisons, and other group quarters. We consider college students to be residents of the place where they live while attending college. We count seasonal residents as living at the place that they consider to be their usual residence.

We have developed methods for Oregon's population estimates to be as accurate as possible. Toward this goal, we work closely with state, county, and city officials, requesting information from them and inviting their review of our methods and estimates.

For estimates for the state population, we rely on the registration of births and deaths for an estimate of natural increase (the excess of births minus deaths). We use school enrollments data for an estimate of net migration for the population under 18 years, non-farm payroll information for the population aged 18 to 64, and Medicare data for the population aged 65 and older.

We base county population estimates on a method called ratio correlation. The ratio correlation method relates changes since the last census to changes in state income tax returns, school enrollments, births, and Medicare enrollments. We track changes in each of these types of administrative data to make an estimate of the current county populations. We also examine changes in the housing stock as a check on the accuracy of the county estimates.

We determine city population estimates based on changes in the housing stock. City officials report each year on the changes in their city's housing stock (for single family units, multi-family units, and mobile homes) and the number of persons residing in group quarters. We also take into account any population changes that have been due to annexations. We separately estimate possible changes due to the number of people per housing unit and use this information to prepare the city's final population estimate.

We monitor city annexations throughout the year. We are informed about annexations by the office of the Secretary of State. When an annexation occurs, we contact city officials to find out the number of residential

housing units and population, if any, involved in the annexation. If the annexation added people to the city's population, then we certify an updated city population on a quarterly basis, in a special report to the Secretary of State's office.

We base annual July 1 population estimates on administrative data available to us in September and October each year. We prepare preliminary estimates for cities and counties in mid-November. Based on reviews that we receive from city and county officials, we revise the annual population estimates and release final population estimates in December. When done, we release the city and county estimates on our Population Research Center website. We publish all estimates in this report, generally available in March each year.
