


- Exploitative natural resource extraction

- Data colonization






Maps help us conceptualize humans move across time and space.






Maps are essential to understanding social injustices.




Anti-eviction Mapping Project



De-colonial Atlas


Kennedy v. City of Zanesville








Red-lining map: Los Angeles




Americans are taught from an early age to analyze and understand the meaning and manipulation of words, but they are rarely taught the same skills about maps.
