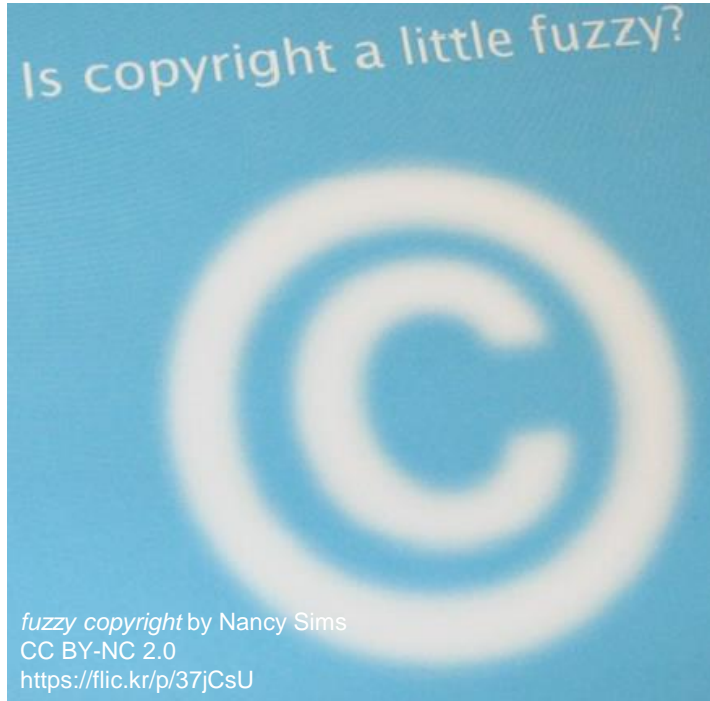

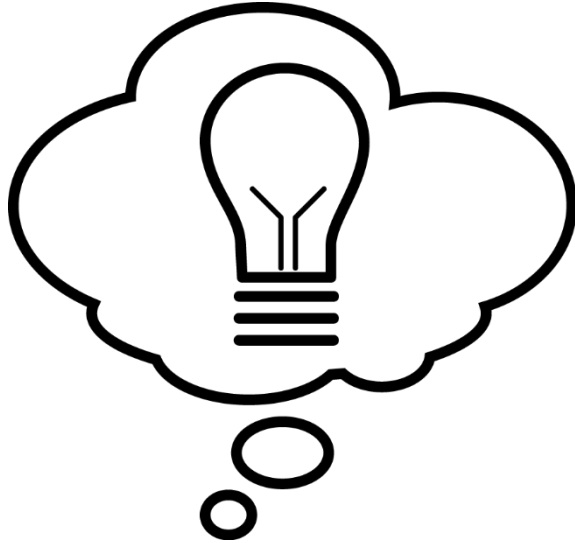
Type of work determines copyright concerns

IR works are “published” works

Inability to apply most user-rights exceptions

Copyright Issues and Student Works in the IR

Opportunity for copyright education



Raises student and faculty awareness

Focuses on the immediate copyright concerns

Possible approaches:

Instructor

Use standard prepared materials

Best to be aware of plans for student work
before the works are created

Copyright in student works

Student own the copyright in their works

Institutions and faculty tend to forget about student copyright

Give consideration to possible future re-uses of the student material

Non-exclusive licenses may be helpful
