# MARKETING

just starting up / chicken & egg issues -  
how do we raise awareness for new things?

- + young faculty (easy to work with)
- tenured faculty (difficult to work with)
- + appreciate metrics/reports for impact
- + department chairs!
- + encourage friendly competition (Biology is doing great) <sup>examples to motivate</sup>
- ? move on from reluctant faculty
- + top-down directive from administration would be helpful (for some)
- + Provost-level connections, communications
- + reports! (university level marketing)
- ✗ top-down doesn't always work

- + labor-intensive at first, pays off in the end (assessment)
- + department meetings - show and tell
- + mention tenure
- + make it a requirement of tenure?
- + become BFFs w/ marketing people
- + campus newsletters / press-releases
- twitter? audience? needs engagement from users, not broadcast
- + faculty champions! how do you find them?
- + newer faculty are better trained RE: OR

- ① target younger/newer faculty
- ② grassroots to build interest / word of mouth - key people
- ③ frame conversations around campus priorities i.e., affordability, prestige, student research

# Journal

- How to maintain interest - tie to a class; Faculty is in charge of direct oversight
- > How do you start ~~Journal~~ when there is no Journal / Publishing background.
- > Differences between hosting / Managing Journal  
when you are not a "press" how do you manage a journal
- APPRENTICE
- Successful non-student journals are often tied to niche groups w/ built-in structures & audiences; Georgia Libraries  
- It's okay if the journal dies/hibernation after 1-2 years  
Content is still archived and discoverable.
- Unrewarded work / Prestigious - ways to recognize more

- need to build in departmental value/prestige to journal management to help engage Fac, Students

# Preservation

- Some out of box IRs don't mesh with metadata and import/export of data
- How many institutions have a ~~digital~~ digital Preservation plan?
- How to maintain Disk space? Long term?
- How to evaluate the ability for a system to preserve? There aren't many tools.
- Would be nice to have a list of possible issues if IT support doesn't provide disk space and funding/tech support
- You can't assume things are backed up/preserved. Build in Organizational checks.
