




STAKING OUR CLAIM

Description	Presented at the ARMA Canada Conference, 2013, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. Archivists and records managers are keenly aware of the need to manage digital records as potential evidence. Electronically stored information in general, and metadata specifically, is not only considered as documentary evidence under the business records sections of the Canada Evidence Act, but metadata has also been considered as real and even demonstrative evidence in recent case law rulings in Canada. Presented originally at the ARMA Canada Conference in Saskatoon, SK in June 2013, this poster highlights the distinguishing characteristics of metadata used as documentary, real, and demonstrative evidence and argues that a finer understanding of metadata must become part of the records manager's knowledge arsenal in the digital records environment.



CHALLENGES

- Commitment: No service level agreement or MOU with partners
- Capacity: Competing priorities disrupt consistent service delivery
- Complexity: Standards are rigorous but also nuanced and time-intensive to apply
- Communication: Issues can take longer to resolve




SOLUTIONS

- Commitment: Service expectations documented
- Capacity: Content is prioritized and triaged with a 3-5 business day turnaround
- Complexity: Submitter and reviewer guidelines, and metadata manual provide consistency
- Communication: Project and task tracking software. Bi-weekly (now monthly) staff meetings. Cataloguing Librarian in cIRcle office one day per week
