



Total Population and Race/Ethnicity

- The Census Bureau estimates the population of states and counties by race, ethnicity, and age.
- These estimates are used to develop weights for the American Community Survey. However, the ACS questionnaire includes a "Some Other Race" category, whereas the population estimates do not.

 Most people who choose "Some Other Race" also identify as Hispanic/Latino



Households by Type, State of Oregon



Age 65+ Living Alone, State of Oregon



Poverty Rate, All Persons



Poverty Rate, Persons Under Age 18



Share of Oregonians without Health Insurance




Domestic In- and Out-Migration



Domestic Migration by Age Group, 2017


