
The main question I came away from the SE Coalition meeting was "What's it all for?"

People have obviously already put in a lot of work on what they believe to be a comprehensive planning effort. Last spring they were instructed to start identifying and preparing a map of the issues and problems in their areas. Richmond, Buckman, and HAND have already sent out questionnaires and Sunnyside is on its way. Each of the neighborhoods have developed relatively clear goals statements, and Buckman and Sellwood have essentially produced complete land use plans for their neighborhoods.

But frankly, I can't see any evidence that we in the Bureau care beans about any of the work that has been done. Did any of us even request copies of the statements which had been prepared for this meeting? We've admitted we don't want to deal with existing problems, and there have been enough references to the "Fourth Option" being a political pacifier that I can no longer take seriously.

Last year there was a debate over how the Comprehensive Plan should develop - Building up from the neighborhood level or starting with City wide options and applying them onto smaller areas. The resolution to this debate was supposedly a compromise position of trying to work at each level simultaneously, "the City-wide land use policy options being developed concurrently with the neighborhood land use plan options" (Planning Commission Minutes, March 22, 1977).

I think what, in fact, has happened is that we have reverted to the standard form of citizen participation where the City develops its options and goes to the people for feedback. We are not asking citizens to contribute the familiarity they have with an area to help us actually formulate an option, nor do the Three Options we have



The current process for citizen involvement is not what people were led to expect a year ago. It is our responsibility to make the current process as clear as possible and not put people through a lot of illusionary hoops. (The next time we print T-shirts, they should say "Official City Responder".)

The SE Coalition, unlike many other districts, has a unique combination of people with planning skills as well as long time neighborhood activists. In the past they have been able to mobilize a lot of visible support for the activities they have been involved in. But from my perception they no longer have access to skilled organizers who know how to both coordinate and instigate the kind of support necessary to successfully wage a campaign for a Fourth Option.

Internally also they seem to be suffering from a lack of unity with Sellwood. If anyone is going to create problems in S.E. it will be Carl Glanzman. I can't figure out exactly where he is coming from, but I think we should watch his activities.

This meeting made me aware of how necessary it will be for us to have a very tight structure to our workshops. If attention is to be focused on the options we are proposing we will need not only a brief and clear summary of each; but also specific questions for people to answer concerning each option.
