Militarization of Okinawa

Okinawa currently hosts over 74% of US military bases in Japan despite making up only 0.6% of Japan's total land mass



How has the dual colonization of Okinawa produced gendered and militarized violence against the local women and girls?

"Let's go rape a girl," he proposed. "It was just for fun."

> "What fools!...For the price they paid to rent the car, they (the U.S. Service men) could have had a girl (sex worker)."



50th year anniversary of the end of World War II and 40+ years of gendered militarized violence
