Background

What is a Heritage Language?

A language spoken in the home other than the dominant language.

What is a Heritage Language Speaker?

An individual "raised in a home where a non-English language is spoken" and "speaks or at least understands the language" in addition to English.

(Inan, 2021; Tesser et al., 2008; Valdes, 2001)

Our Research Questions:

Language status

What is the nature of the relationship between a heritage language's status in society and language maintenance across generations? Community advice

To what extent does the information parents receive from community members (e.g., health professionals, teachers, friends, and family members) influence their beliefs in passing their heritage language to their children?


Parent beliefs

How do parents' beliefs about the impact of a heritage language on academic, social, and career success influence the degree to which they pass this language to their children?

Methods

- PRISMA-SCR & JBI
- Database searches in:
 - EBSCOhost, PsycINFO, Linguistics and Language Behavior Abstracts, Google Scholar, ProQuest Dissertations and Theses A&I, and Web of Science
- Screening using predetermined exclusion criteria
 - \circ 2005 2023
 - Qualitative studies, performed in U.S., children 0-18, parents are bilingual
- Coding and Qualitative Content Analysis

Results

Data Extraction Chart:

- ✤ 30 papers
 - \rightarrow Articles (n = 18)
 - > Theses/dissertations (n = 11)
 - \succ Conference paper (n = 1)
- Over 20 heritage languages included in studies
- Study methodology (i.e., ethnographies, phenomenological research, multiple-case studies, mixed-methods)
