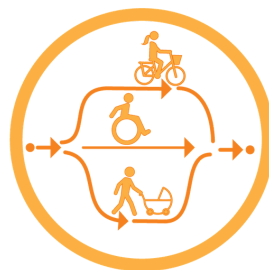
The Ready Streets Parkrose/Argay Project

The project focused on two neighborhoods in East Portland- **Parkrose and Argay**- and found that a lot of people leave the neighborhood to do basic tasks like shop, go to work, or visit the doctor. After an **earthquake**, damage to the roads will make this hard to do. SAFE Planning gave some ideas to our client, the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT), to make the neighborhood **better prepared**:

Earthquake safe roads and bridges



Different uses for roads, other than car travel



More investment in the local community



Local power to make decisions
